<u>RESOLUTION NO. 83 – APPROVING A JEFFERSON ECONOMIC RECOVERY PLAN</u> Ald. Tully introduced Resolution No. 83.

CITY OF JEFFERSON RESOLUTION NO. 83

WHEREAS, this Economic Recovery Plan (the Plan) effort, funded by the Economic Development Administration (EDA), began in response to the closure of Tyson Foods' Plant on July 9, 2016; and

WHEREAS, the Plan document summarizes the process, findings, and recommendations of the Economic Recovery Planning effort. Utilizing an EDA grant awarded to the City of Jefferson, development of this Economic Recovery Plan was completed from January to August 2017. Research and analysis were conducted to develop a broad understanding of the existing economic and physical conditions in Jefferson. In addition to analyses conducted and reported in the Plan and supplementary materials, the steering committee, stakeholder interviews, work sessions, and focus groups provided local expertise related to the community's economic priorities; and

WHEREAS, the Plan presents a focused Economic Recovery Strategy that can help guide public and private decision-making toward an economically strong and sustainable future. The Economic Development Strategy is an achievable place-based goal for a future Jefferson around which residents, business leaders for large, medium and small companies, including local entrepreneurs, and other interested parties can structure their own efforts to advance Jefferson's economic future; and

WHEREAS, the Jefferson Redevelopment Authority has reviewed and is recommending adoption of the Economic Recovery Plan and the public was afforded an opportunity to review the Plan and submit both written and verbal comments at a November 28, 2017 community forum, the Plan is now ready for consideration and adoption by the Jefferson Common Council; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Common Council of the City of Jefferson that it herein approves the Jefferson Economic Recovery Plan prepared for the community and directs City staff to take steps where practical to work toward its implementation.

WHEREAS, the current Contract for Fire Protection Services and the Contract for Emergency Medical Services with the Townships of Farmington, Hebron, Jefferson and Oakland (**collectively the Townships**) expire December 31, 2017; and

WHEREAS, the City of Jefferson and representatives of the Townships have negotiated new five (5) year Contracts for fire protection services and emergency medical services, with each Contract covering the period January 1, 2018 through December 31, 2022; and

WHEREAS, the Jefferson Finance Committee participated in the Contract negotiations and is recommending approval of each Contract to the City Council; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of Jefferson, Wisconsin that it herein approves and ratifies the Contract for Fire Protection Service for the period 2018-2022 between the City of Jefferson and the Townships of Farmington, Hebron, Jefferson and Oakland and the Contract for Emergency Medical Services for the period 2018-2022 between the City of Jefferson and the Townships of Farmington, Hebron, Jefferson and Oakland and authorizes the City Administrator and City Clerk to execute said Contracts on behalf of the City of Jefferson subject to the consent of the City Attorney.

Ald. Krause, seconded by Ald. Miller moved to approve Resolution No. 84. On call of the roll, motion carried unanimously.

Adjourn to Closed Session Pursuant to Section 19.85(1)(f) of the Wisconsin State Statutes regarding confidential employee medical history and Section 19.85(1)(g) of the Wisconsin State Statutes to confer with legal counsel with respect to litigation in which it is or is likely to become involved.

Ald. Peachey, seconded by Ald. Lares moved to adjourn the December 19, 2017 meeting of the Common Council at 8:03 p.m. On a voice vote, motion carried unanimously.
