CITY OF JEFFERSON PROPOSED ORDINANCE #3-23 The Common Council of the City of Jefferson, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Section 300-19 B. of the Zoning map, City of Jefferson, Wisconsin, which is herein made a part, is amended to change district boundaries of Tax Parcel 241-0614-1524-001 from RH-35 Rural Holding to MI Medium Industrial.

Description:

Subdivision 24 SE ¼ of NW ¼ Lot 2, Parent Parcel is Lot 1, Lot 2 will be 17.072 Acres.

Parcel #: 241-0614-1524-001

Proposed Permanent Zoning Designation: MI Medium Industrial.

RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE TALK READ PLAY PLAYSPACES GRANT FROM THE GREATER WATERTOWN COMMUNITY HEALTH FOUNDATION

CITY OF JEFFERSON RESOLUTION NO. 6

WHEREAS, the City of Jefferson was awarded a Talk Read Play Playspace grant from the Greater Watertown Community Health Foundation, and;

WHEREAS, this grant will provide playground equipment for children ages 6 months to 5 years while encouraging parents to talk, read and play with their children, and;

WHEREAS, the location of this playground equipment is set to be at Rock River Landing Park, and;

WHEREAS, the grant includes the playground, installation and safety surfacing materials at a value of \$75,000;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Common Council that the City of Jefferson will accept the Talk Read Play Playspace grant from the Greater Watertown Community Health Foundation to install a playground in Rock River Landing Park for children 6 months to 5 years.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE PURCHASE OF A 2024 AERIAL LIFT TRUCK

CITY OF JEFFERSON RESOLUTION NO. 7

WHEREAS, The City of Jefferson purchased a 2003 Aerial Truck in 2018 for \$45,000; and

WHEREAS, this truck receives about 300 hours of service a year and is instrumental in our forestry operations; and

WHEREAS, the hydraulics to operate the boom have failed. The engine is due for an overhaul. After inspection and estimate, the cost of repairs exceeds the value of the truck; and

WHEREAS, staff recently solicited quotes for replacement of a 2003 Aerial Truck for the Jefferson Forestry; and

WHEREAS, Director Keller is requesting that the 2003 Freightliner Aerial Truck be considered surplus equipment and sold at public auction in 2023; and

WHEREAS, the lead time on this equipment is 18 months, it is necessary that we order the equipment in 2023 with delivery in 2024. This purchase will be appropriated in the upcoming 2024 Capital Improvement Project and Equipment Replacement Budget amount of \$171,241 to fund the purchase of a replacement to the aerial truck for the Forestry Department; and

WHEREAS, the Jefferson Finance Committee has reviewed and recommended the purchase of said XT60 Pro Rear Mount Aerial Truck;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Common Council of the City of Jefferson, Wisconsin that it herein authorizes the advance purchase of a XT60 Pro Rear Mount Aerial Truck in the amount of \$171,341 from Custom Truck.
