CITY OF JEFFERSON PROPOSED ORDINANCE #6-23

The Common Council of the City of Jefferson, Wisconsin, do ordain as follows:

Section 1. Section 300-19 B. of the Zoning map, City of Jefferson, Wisconsin, which is herein made a part, is amended to change district boundaries of Tax Parcel 241-0614-0242-008 and 241-0614-0242-009 from sR-5 Single Family to UMU Urban Mixed Use.

DISCUSSION: LUBAHN PARK TRAIL

Park and Rec Director Keller let the committee know that we have \$100,000 grant monies from the Greater Watertown Community Health Foundation (GWCHF) and would like to offer the idea of using the money for a walking trailing at Lubahn Park. Keller had an estimate from Town and County Engineering that the project would cost around \$95,000 for the trail. Keller stated we would need to get an easement from the homeowners to put the pathway in. She would also like to add lighting to the paths that would cost around \$30,000-\$70,000 depending on the lighting. After discussion, it is the consensus of the council to get the criteria for what the money needs to be used for. The money needs to be used by the end of September.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE SALE OF THE NORTH INDUSTRIAL PROPERTY

CITY OF JEFFERSON RESOLUTION NO. 35

WHEREAS, the City of Jefferson is currently completing an expansion of the North Industrial Park to create additional industrially zoned lots for development; and

WHEREAS, the City has received an "Offer to Purchase" Contract from Kingdom Shalom Properties, Inc., d/b/a Kool Trikes North, LLC to relocate their business to the North Industrial Park. The first phase of the development includes construction of an approximately 5,000 square foot building, consisting of office, showroom, fabricating, and warehouse space. The construction cost of said development is estimated at \$500,000; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Common Council of the City of Jefferson, Wisconsin that it hereby approves the "Offer to Purchase" Contract and authorizes the City Administrator to execute said Contract on behalf of the City of Jefferson. The sale of industrial property includes the sale of a three (3) acre parcel at a total selling price of \$60,000. Additionally, the City will be responsible for creating this lot utilizing a certified survey map process.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE RIVERFRONT DIAMOND BACKSTOP

CITY OF JEFFERSON RESOLUTION NO. 36

BE IT RESOLVED by the Common Council of the City of Jefferson, Wisconsin that the City of Jefferson obtained two quotes from contractors to remove and replace the diamond one backstop at Riverfront Park. This project will replace the current backstop in its current position.

WHEREAS, the City of Jefferson allocated monies for this project in the 2023 capital improvement plan and;

WHEREAS, the lowest quote was from Lemke Fence Company in the amount of \$21,852;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED that the City of Jefferson authorizes the Parks and Recreation Department staff to enter into an agreement with Lemke Fence Company to demo and install a new backstop on diamond one at Riverfront Park in the amount of \$21,852.
